IF YOU ARE FROM OR LIVED IN ONE OF THESE COUNTRIES, YOU MIGHT QUALIFY FOR TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS

WHAT IS TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS (TPS):

Temporary Protected Status (TPS) is for people who left their home countries because of conflict and natural disasters. A person with TPS:

- Is protected from deportation,
- Can work legally in the United States, and
- May travel with permission.

TPS is usually for 18 months and may be extended. The DHS (government) announces extensions and when to re-register (sign up again).

DO YOU QUALIFY FOR TPS?

To qualify for TPS you must:

- Be from a country on the TPS list,
- Come to the U.S. by a certain date, and
- Sign up for TPS before the deadline

NOTE: Some trips outside the U.S., crimes, or other problems can disqualify you from TPS.
