GLOBAL RISING INTERNATIONAL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Global Rising International Leadership Program provides networking opportunities for international newcomers. Every year, foreign-born residents eager to engage with the community, meet new peers, and expand their professional network in Northeast Ohio can join a Global Rising Cohort.

This nine month program runs from fall to spring, and pairs each participant with a mentor in their field of interest. Mentors serve as a resource for professional and personal development, as well as a way for program participants to network with professionals in the region.

Global Rising also hosts a speaker series, where participants attend intimate discussions with Northeast Ohio leaders. This year's cohort attended speaker sessions with Dr. Airica Steed, Oren Baratz, Patrick Espinosa, Sean Richardson, and more.


NATURALIZATIONS

Global Cleveland has proudly participated in Naturalization Ceremonies since the founding of our organization. We recognize the absolute importance and significance in the Naturalization Ceremony and want to ensure that our newest American citizens feel properly welcomed and supported in our community.

On the first and third Friday of every month, Global Cleveland attends Naturalization Ceremonies held at the Carl B. Stokes Federal Courthouse and other special sites. We gather groups of volunteers to help us celebrate one of the most important days in an immigrant or refugee's life. Our volunteers help us celebrate new citizens by distributing welcome packets, sharing information about available resources, and holding our welcome banner for newly naturalized photo ops.

Our volunteers span all walks of life, and we are so proud to show naturalizing citizens a diverse, friendly welcome from fellow Americans.

UKRAINIAN SPONSOR CIRCLES

In 2023, Global Cleveland received a grant to hire a Ukrainian Volunteer and Outreach Coordinator. Dr. Anastasia Lakhtikova, a Ukrainian immigrant herself, joined our team for a one-year-contract with the goal of helping resettle Ukrainian families in Northeast Ohio.

It is with this support that Global Cleveland began facilitating the formation of over a dozen Sponsor Circles through the United for Ukraine Program.

Sponsor Circle programs are the chance for a group of Americans to welcome international newcomers to the United States. A Sponsor Circle consists of a group of at least five adults who join together and commit to supporting a newcomer into their home community. Collaborating as a group gives Sponsor Circle participants the chance to share the responsibilities of welcoming a newcomer while still making a real difference in a refugee family's lives.

We're proud to have helped over forty Ukrainian refugees settle in Northeast Ohio.

SISTER CITIES

Global Cleveland works to help the city of Cleveland maintain, strengthen, and expand its Sister City relationships around the world. Sister Cities International was created in 1956 by Dwight D. Eisenhower as a way to foster bonds around the world. Sister city relationships are formed when two locations enter into a legal or social agreement that is designed to create commercial and cultural ties.

At the beginning of 2023, the city had 23 Sister City relationships, spanning across Europe, Asia, Africa, and South America. Out of all those 23 cities, only four were located in Africa. Because Cleveland is made up of a majority of African-American citizens, we recognized that our Sister Cities should better reflect the demographics of our own city. This spurred our organization to begin seeking out new African Sister Cities.

WELCOMING OUR KIGALI, CAPE TOWN, TEMA, NEW SISTER CITIES: RWANDA SOUTH AFRICA GHANA

Crystal Bryant, William Gary, and Kwame Botchway helped Global Cleveland establish connections with Tema, Ghana. Brian Hall and Rwandan businessman Emery Rubagenda aided in establishing Cleveland's connections with Kigali, Rwanda, and Kevin Clayton helped Global Cleveland enter talks with Cape Town, South Africa.



REFUGEE SERVICES RETENTION

In 2023, the Jewish Federation of Cleveland made Global Cleveland aware that the Hebrew Immigrant Aid Society (HIAS) needed a new, local organization to partner with in order to continue providing their refugee resettlement services in Cleveland. If HIAS were unable to find a suitable partner organization, Cleveland would lose up to 500 refugees resettling in our region each year.

Global Cleveland immediately went to work looking for a partnering organization and identified the May Dugan Center as the perfect partner for HIAS. The May Dugan Center is a non-profit organization that serves over 20,000 individuals and families who need effective and meaningful programs that will improve their lives and their communities.

Next, Global Cleveland worked to raise the proper funds to support May Dugan in this new partnership. Our team raised \$450,000 for May Dugan, allowing HIAS to continue refugee resettlement in Cleveland.
